#### DESCRIPTION

Trio Capital transcends the label of simply being an avant-garde jazz trio; it represents, from a deeply personal standpoint, a profound immersion into cultural roots, enriched by a wide range of folkloric influences ranging

from the evocative sounds of Ethiopia to the characteristic rhythms and influences of flamenco.

Led by the talented double bassist Javier Moreno, the ensemble's repertoire not only seeks to captivate with its music, but also to provoke reflection on identity and connection with roots. Through his compositions, Moreno proposes a vital, first-person journey that has Madrid as its point of departure and arrival, but also travels through cities such as New York, Rome, and Buenos Aires—cities where Moreno has resided.

This project marks Javier Moreno's fourth album with the Fresh Sound New Talent label, further consolidating his presence in the jazz music scene.

Moreno, currently residing in Madrid, actively participates in the avant-garde and contemporary jazz scene from this city. He has carved his path through collaborations with many artists worldwide, having previously resided in New York City for nearly a decade. His music serves as a vibrant testimony to the cultural richness and global connection that define the aesthetic of contemporary jazz's new trends.

The ensemble has had the opportunity to perform in both quintet and trio formats at emblematic venues nationwide, such as: "The Piano Man" in New Delhi (India), the Fendika Cultural Centre in Addis Ababa (Ethiopia), the Conde Duque Auditorium within the Jazz Festival of the city of Madrid, the prestigious Jimmy Glass club in Valencia, Taller de Músicos in Gijón, Alpedrete Jazz Festival (Madrid) or the Carlos de Amberes Foundation (Madrid)

### MAREIKE WIENING



Drummer, composer and bandleader Mareike Wiening has distinguished herself, bringing "a planar modulating harmonic language and a propulsive drift" (Giovanni Russonello- New York Times) to the most compelling jazz music of today. Ms. Wiening's music was described as "thoroughly modern, progressive jazz, Mareike Wiening's album has many layers that unfold with each repeated hearing; she will most definitely become a leading part of the jazz scene in the years to come." Future Memories, her second album as a leader, was released in November 2021 on American/Canadian label Greenleaf Music. With her quintet she is

currently nominated for the German Jazz Award in category "Band of the Year". Wiening is based in Cologne, Germany, after living in New York City for over six years.

Besides leading her own quintet featuring Rich Perry, Glenn Zaleski, Alex Goodman and Johannes Felscher, Ms. Wiening is also an in demand side-woman in the New York jazz scene and in Europe. Venues and festivals such as New York's Winter Jazzfest, Atlanta Jazz Festival, Elbjazz Hamburg, Juan Le Pins, The Jazz Gallery, Blue Note NYC, German Consulate and the Carnegie Hall and Bird's Eye Basel are only a few of her regular performance places.

Wiening is a lecturer for jazz drums at the University of Arts and Music in Zurich, Switzerland. She endorses Meinl Cymbals and Meinl Sticks&Brush exclusively.

## **ROMAN FILIU**



Román Filiú has been a saxophonist, orchestra leader and composer for more than 20 years. Born and raised in Santiago de Cuba, he has played, recorded and toured the world with a wide variety of artists. He leads several groups, such as Quarteira, que Musae or the Roman Filiú Quartet. Among his many collaborations, Román has played in Chucho Valdés' Irakere project, has been the musical director of David Murray's Big Band, and has played with prominent musicians such as Andrew Cyrille, Gonzalo Rubalcaba (Grammy Award nominee with Antiguo), Dafnis Prieto (Grammy Award winner in 2018), Milford Graves, Miguel Zenón and Omara Portuondo, to name a few.

Double bass player and composer born in Madrid. He resides for a long time in the city of New York, with intermittent stays in different places such

as Rome or Buenos Aires carrying out intense and dedicated professional activity towards jazz in all its aspects.

He studied at institutions such as New York University (New York) (Master in Jazz Performance and Composition) and the Royal Conservatory of the City of The Hague. (Holland) (Higher Bachelor's Degree in Jazz)

Receives awards, scholarships, and recognitions such as: Banff Center of Creative Arts (Canada) Tete Montoliú (AIE) (Spain); Caja Madrid Foundation (Spain), ART-EXT, (AECID) (Spain), National Endowment for the arts. (USA) MacDowell Colony (USA), Exploring the Metropolis (USA) or the Royal Academy of Spain scholarship in Rome. (AECID), (Rome-Italy).
